Mindful of social distancing requirements, a priest is asked this year to give the blessing by extending hands over all gathered while saying the prayer of blessing: “Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. A general blessing will be given on Friday, February 3rd at the 6:45 AM Mass only.

Preschool Information

Why is a Catholic Funeral Important?

Although, no one enjoys dwelling on death, most of us will mourn and bury loved ones in our lifetimes. Friends may counsel us to skip the church funeral and just “get it over with,” but our faith provides the strength we need to deal with death. The church has created Rites to help us face the difficulties and reality of death. Every baptized Catholic has a right to a Catholic funeral. The Rites of a Catholic Funeral include Prayers after Death, Prayers in the Presence of the Body, the Scripture Prayer Service at the Wake, the Funeral at Church (with or without Mass), and the Internment Prayer Service at the cemetery. Together these services not only make up the total Catholic Funeral Service, but also provide the Church’s special prayers for the deceased. The Rites also support families and friends who are grieving for their loved ones. Catholics are entitled to a Catholic Funeral whether they are frequent or infrequent Mass attendees.

Why do Catholics Pray the Rosary?
The Rosary is a simple prayer adapted from the complex set of prayers of medieval monks. It’s a powerful prayer because in it, we ask Mary—whose prayers are never refused—to pray for us. In addition, through the mysteries of the Rosary, we meditate on the life of Jesus which always bears fruit. For example, the fruit of the mystery of the Annunciation is humility. Praying the Rosary opens us to graces that help us be more Christ-like.

Why do Catholics Believe the Pope is Infallible? As visible head of the Church on earth, the Pope has the gift of infallibility. This means that by gift of the Holy Spirit, the pope can’t err in teaching the faith. That’s not to say that a pope is a perfect person. This gift of the Holy Spirit helps the pope, and the bishops with him, guide the Church in staying faithful to Christ. The pope is only infallible when he solemnly declares a teaching on faith and morals as St. Peter’s successor.

The following are the flavors of pies available: Apple/Apple Crumb, Blueberry/Blueberry Crumb, Cherry/Cherry Crumb, Peach/Peach Crumb, Strawberry/Strawberry Crumb, Shoo-Fly, Coconut Custard and Lemon Sponge

Our nine (9) inch pies will arrive shrink wrapped and boxed ready for delivery. Our pies are freshly made and should be delivered to your customers promptly-the same day. Please **DO NOT let them sit in a warm room or car.** After a pie is baked, room temperature is its enemy. For best results keep pies refrigerated. Many customers like to freeze our pies for later enjoyment. We suggest you do not freeze custard type (lemon sponge, coconut, pumpkin) as they have eggs and milk and become watery when frozen. The fruit pies with a lid are the most successful to freeze. Remove from the freezer, remove wrap, let thaw, partially or totally, place on a cookie sheet and re-bake at 325-375 F. for 10-20 minutes, and enjoy.

A Little Reminder For Cemetery Lot Owners in order to keep bringing all our Parish Cemeteries in line with the guidelines and regulations of the Diocese the following will still be enforced: all bricks, fine & crushed stone, plants, fresh & plastic flowers not in containers, fences, borders of all types will be removed & discarded immediately due to the fact that they cause a problem for maintenance of your lot. Again, anything that interferes with the mowing & trimming of grass will be removed at the family’s expense. Containers should not interfere with the care of the cemetery grounds. If they do, the containers will be removed immediately. No planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs allowed. Plastic flowers must be in containers also.

The Keys to Holiness

Holiness will help us to get to Heaven and comes when we surrender to God's will and put all of our trust in him. **Courage.** During the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5), Jesus said, "**blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are they who mourn,**" and promised that when we turn to God in times of trial, we will be comforted and cared for. Trusting God in difficult times takes courage. **Discipline.** Jesus makes it clear that we must apply the correct principles to our habits and use God’s laws as our standards. When he talked about "**the meek, the merciful, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,**" he was giving us a ruler. We are to measure our behavior against these standards to see if we are on the right path to holiness. **Endurance.** Only a true follower of Christ can put the Sermon on the Mount fully into practice. It takes endurance to combine holy inner attitudes with these outward actions and keep it up for life.

We Never Lose God’s Love

Have you ever had someone end a relationship with you because of a mistake you made or something you did wrong? It’s a terrible feeling to lose someone’s love. Fortunately, God’s love doesn’t depend on how good we are. Remember the parable Jesus told of the prodigal son (Luke 15)? No matter what the son’s transgressions, the father received him in complete love. That’s how God feels about us.

Think of God’s love as the light from the sun – it’s so bright we can’t comprehend it. Sometimes we close our eyes or pull the curtains to keep the light from coming in. It is still there, but we can’t experience it because we have shut it out. Sin shuts our hearts to God’s love.

To help, Jesus created the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Receiving absolution and being assured of God’s forgiveness opens our shuttered hearts so we can feel God’s love again. So whether or not we feel loved by God is up to us. All we have to do is ask.
